
Congratulations to you both

Short courses with Jon Lam

In the last couple of months, 11 BSA members have enrolled into my class to do an art and design course. It was meant to be 5 weekly classes but was cut short due to hall availability.

So, it became 3 fortnightly classes. It turned out well as it gives members a fortnight to do some extra work at home to recapitulate what was done at the workshop and with pleasing results.

Over the three workshops, we covered

- Streetscape (week 1), Landscape (week 2) and Waterscape (week3)
- Composition.
- Ariel and Linear perspectives and values to create depths.
- Understanding key design Elements and design Principles.
- Add people and animals to generate interest in a painting.
- Painting techniques (any media) when necessary.
- How some mistakes in watercolour can be corrected.
- A general and positive critique of all work created in class or at home.

May I take this opportunity to thank and congratulate the members that have attended this course. You have done well and acquired some valuable skill and tips in your pursuit of creating art.

I would also like to thank you for being so friendly and co-operative especially at pack up time.


At time of writing, 9 out of 11 has provided me with feedback and quite a few of you had express an interest to continue with the course. Thank you for your positive responses.


Here is his work on cards and my piece copied from a black and white photograph provided by David. A brilliant workshop.

- You are responsible for your own sales at this event. Sometimes the machine is available..









