### Important statement from our President Trudy, re Annual Art Show.

Our Annual Art Exhibition was a great success as we all know.

The current rules of entry to our annual exhibition have been the same for a number of years and in the most part, rely on the integrity of members to follow those rules. The hanging of an artwork is acceptance by the Society that those entry conditions are met. Bearing in mind this is an exhibition for BSA only, those conditions need be accepted by all members. It was therefore unfortunate that an allegation of an oversized artwork was made after the artworks were hung, upsetting one or more of our members. That allegation was found to be incorrect and we sincerely apologies for the hurt and upset that allegation has caused.

Restricting the size of artworks was put in place purely due to issues with accommodating the number of artworks in the space available. The measuring of artworks prior to hanging has never been done and it is quite possible artworks slightly over the limit have been accepted for hanging in the past. This may have been where an artist had only one or two entries instead of four and space was available.

However, this area of measurement of an art work will be discussed at length within the committee and any changes to that rule will be put to members for consideration.
















# Offsite Painting


